#### **Project Updates**

#### Stonefields Bellus Apartments

Bellus Apartments, a new 5 storey - 80 unit residential apartment block in Stonefields, is well underway and the work is starting to develop real momentum. The piling operation has been a challenge with 600 diameter piles having to be drilled through fractured rock and some of the piles requiring extensions due to geotechnical conditions. The last of the 101 building piles were completed on 18<sup>th</sup> April and the foundations and basement slab construction activities are progressing well with completion in May. The vertical construction has commenced with columns, in-situ walls and precast beams / floors being installed.


There are now two cranes fully operational on site servicing the 124m long footprint. These include a Potain Hammerhead tower crane covering 60 % of the site and a 250 Tonne Crawler Crane covering the balance. The site has a full complement of machinery at present. Two large cranes, 80t Pile rig, multiple diggers and trucks. The site logistics are certainly keeping the team on their toes.

Market conditions have dictated that we adopt an in-situ wall solution for the basement walls rather than precast concrete. There are over 320m of basement walls to be constructed, a challenge for the Harbour Construction boys.

The structure and roof are due for completion towards the end of the year, ready for the façade and fit-out trades to follow. Project completion is on track for a handover in August 2017

The site team has continued to increase significantly and the team is working well together.

A social committee is charged with providing the team with options to share a bit of friendly rivalry and fun.



### Fred Thomas Drive Car Park

A great effort from the team has ensured we are very close to completing this car park project for Smales Farm.

The services teams are carrying out testing and commissioning works while the external site works are progressing. The barrier arms are being installed along with access control and security cameras. The client has already taken occupation of the ground floor tenancy and some external areas for tenant car parking. We have a number of late variation works to install and complete prior to being able to apply for CCC in a few weeks time.



#### Stonefields Verto Apartments

Verto Apartments located in the Stonefields development in Mt Wellington commenced on August 2015 and is due for completion early November 2016.

Our Client is a JV between Todd Property Group and Fletcher Living.

This design-build project is a 5 level building housing 60 No. apartments. There is a mix of 1, 2 and 3 bedroom apartments with external ground level car parking provided.

Harbour Construction have carried out the concrete works, and the casting of the roof slab on 15<sup>th</sup> April was a major milestone for the team. First fix and façade elements are progressing well with work underway on the first 4 levels.

Our team is, Gene Larsen, Lance Blomfield, Les Gates, Terry Grant, Francois De Kock and Dale Sadler.

Having our sister-site, Bellus, around the corner creates plenty of opportunity for friendly rivalry and banter within the Stonefields team. The recent Ten Pin Bowling evening was enjoyed by all. The Verto team won with ease, we would add, and by a significant margin.



## Bloom Edinburgh Stage 2 PUKEKOHE

Stage 2 of the Bloom Edinburgh project is nearing completion.

The building is completed and site works are well underway. Landscaping, fencing and planting of trees and hedges has commenced and will be finished for the handover in May.

The first owners will be moving in within days of handover.



#### **Grand Horizon Project - SkyCity**

This exciting 14 week project will deliver, for the first time in SKYCITY's history, a VIP Gaming Salon on the eastern side of Federal Street.

The refurbished floor area, which is located on Level 7 of the Grand Hotel, will accommodate three private Gaming Salons for international players.

After a great effort from all those involved including key subcontractors, we have achieved Practical Completion and students have already moved in.

The Pines, a four level, 52 unit apartment block with 2 x road level retail units in sunny Browns Bay is progressing well with completion on target for July 2016.

Wiltshire house unitised window system was completed on 8<sup>th</sup> April 2016 after a delay of one week due to high winds and rain.

All that now remains is the internal concrete screed and waterproofing to the roof, including coring for a significant down pipe.
