Project Updates


Sugartree Stage 2B

Stage 2 (\$72m) is going great guns with the structure all but complete and the fit-out and finishes progressing well on programme. In November we completed over \$5m value of work, a record for a Kalmar site.

The Kalmar team is growing in size with a number of young enthusiastic guys joining us to bring the project in on time. Sadly, none of them has been able to topple the all-Sugartree table tennis champ – Paul Feltham – but that hasn't stopped them from trying.

Sugartree Stage 2 is Kalmar's flagship project and remains solidly on track for a successful finish on time.

We are looking forward to celebrating the success of the project at the Roof Shout which is to be held on the 24th of March.



Stonefields Bellus Apartments

The Bellus building is rapidly taking shape under the shroud of the fully scaffolded exterior. The site numbers have increased markedly with work taking place on all levels internally and externally. The car park is filled to the max every day and the mobile coffee operator who visits each morning is doing ok as well.

Bellus is a large site (123m long) so the guys are chalking up the foot kms and needing an extra sandwich in the lunchbox. Keeping tabs on the all of the subs is a major task for the team, but is well under control.

Our own team has increased to meet the demands and is headed up by Neil and Steve. Vince has led the charge on the successful completion of structure and is now focused on the intricacies of the podium and surrounds. Jason is dealing with the busy façade and many external building elements, the majority of which are unseen because of the fully scaffolded exterior. Ed, Oliver (off to get hitched this month), Sunny, Alan and Manie are spread through the interior, driving those activities. The latter 3 having joined from Verto. Shane is busy tracking the comings and goings at the site entry. You certainly know if anyone is not toeing the line. The commercial team headed by Donald have completed procurement and is now focused on the ongoing QS demands. Sadly the team bids farewell to NJ who is off to Sugartree Stage 3. His achievements have not gone unnoticed and we are very appreciative of his efforts and contribution to the project.

We have finishing activities underway on the lowest levels, plasterboard linings well advanced on the next 3 levels and first fix well advanced on the last level. The roof membrane is making good progress. The external glazing is close to finalised, brickwork nearly finished and bagging is underway. ACP and Terracotta trades are underway.

The project reached a milestone with the removal of the tower crane early Feb and the crawler early March.

The team are very focused on the targeted completion mid-year after all having a well-earned Christmas break. We are looking forward to the unveiling of the external façade shortly to reveal what will be an impressive looking building.



The James

The project comprises 7 levels with 29 high-end apartments located on Khyber Pass, Newmarket. Core City is a new Client for Kalmar.

The onsite team (Greg Hoeben, Aaron Goddard, Lance Blomfield, William Lahert, Surajpal Channa) have done a great job of navigating through the complications with the in ground extra works and overcoming the legacies of the shotcrete wall encroachment into the building line. (Inherited from previous groundworks contractor). In addition the site is extremely tight with next to no laydown and to compound matters the loading zone is a major bus lane located close to a busy intersection on Khyber Pass. The guys have quickly become experts on the TMP process.

The structure is starting to fly with Level 3 (2nd suspended level) poured the first week of Feb. The target is to have the structure complete early April and roof on during May. The targeted floor cycle is 12 days. Harbour Construction are responsible for the concrete structure and K2 Interiors have a key role in the interiors. The latter commencing early April.

The updated contractual completion is 17th October 2017.







The Oaks

The \$30m Oaks project in Warkworth is the 1st stage of a large retirement village right in the centre of town. This stage incorporates 63 apartments ranging from 1 to 3 bedrooms, and ground floor retail. This is within two separate multi-level buildings situated on a large common plaza. The ground floor covers the entire site and forms the full basement carpark.

Kalmar arrived on site at the end of October 2016 and have been preparing the site for ground beams whilst working around the client's piling contractor. We are targeting the ground floor slab pours to Building A early in mid February and will be ready to commence the structural steel erection by the end of the month. Also at this time we will commence the basement bulk excavation using the top-down methodology. This is a very interesting process as we are dealing with a confined space scenario and extensive planning and preparation for this has been taking place over the past two months. We erected our tower crane just before Christmas, a first for Warkworth. We have been enjoying the dry weather, which helps us keep the site dry. The site has a very high water table and we will continually have to monitor and pump water when necessary.

Our site team has grown over the past month with the arrival of Wayne McKeown and Brett Curling in January. Harbour Construction have a strong presence on site and are carrying out a large concrete carpentry package. We're all well set up and comfortable in our new site office above the old tavern (that's right Dallas, we are in a pub!) overlooking the site. We are using local subcontractors where possible and currently have Davco Electrical, MS Engineering and Mason Contractors are on board. We welcome them to the project and to working with Kalmar.

We're looking forward to a successful project conclusion in April 2018.







8-10 Whitaker Place

The project is progressing with new structure being erected on top of the existing building above level 11. Structural steel work has now reached level 14 and the L13 slab is complete.

The complexities of the refurbishment work are uncovering unknown issues such as non-compliant workmanship, water damage etc. which has occurred over the life of the building. These issues have now been scoped and we are progressively resolving them.

The internal works are occurring concurrently on all levels with level 3 and 4 being the most advanced through the fit out process. The existing lift core is currently being refurbished with new support steel for the lift rails being installed and new lift fronts being built on all levels. The passive fire remedial works are a large component of compliance work to the existing structure as some walls were retained after the demolition phase. The existing 30 year old façade, below level 10, is receiving a mini make over with all existing external rubber seals being replaced and new external flashing to be installed over the coming months.

On the team front, Michael van der Walt has gone to the Warkworth site, Lance Blomfield will be looking after the remaining Harbour works and Gilbert Han has joined our team as trainee Site Engineer.







Bloom Henderson Stage 1

Stage 1 of Bloom Henderson is now well underway with Stage 2 planned to start mid-2017.

The site which was previously occupied by a retired couple in a large house with tennis court has been completely cleared including a large area of asbestos contaminated soil. Once completed the 36-unit development made up of two 18-unit three-storey blocks will provide retirement living in freehold unit titled apartments. The buildings are similar in design to previous projects for Bloom Living, but this time weatherboard cladding replaces the brick veneer.
