Project Updates

Bloom Manurewa

The team at Bloom Manurewa have been working tirelessly to complete the 72 unit apartment development for Bloom Living. The typical spring weather has been challenging to the landscaping and external works to say the least, but a determined workforce has helped to push through.

The council and client final inspections are complete and we are ready for project handover. Full credit to Kalmar's project team delivering this project to a high standard, and for their collective efforts on another successful Bloom development.

With Bloom Manurewa coming to an end, both Ryno and Rob Cunnington have been working behind the scenes to secure this client's next project. Located in Henderson, the 24 unit apartment block commences in November 2019 earning Ryno a well-deserved break as he heads back to South Africa to tie the knot. Fabric Apartments

Fabric of Onehunga is continuing to build momentum despite the weather that has been challenging the team to complete the structure, and start achieving water tightness to support the progress of the internal fit-out. The structures are now complete to the 3 stand alone buildings completing the bulk of Harbour's concrete scope, and the Harbour carpentry crews are increasing in numbers to get the roof cladding started. With the buildings taking shape and the cladding materials being installed the visual appearance is starting to resemble the architectural renders.

Building F, A and B are well underway with façade and fit-out works in full construction mode across the levels. Building F, the first separable portion, is nearly watertight which marks a significant milestone for the project, and preparation for the roof shout is underway.

With the last of the staged project consents coming through is another significant milestone on the design front. The site team fronted by Dario Parolin, Neil Spencer and Donald Chataira are working actively with the whole team to continue the momentum that this project is gaining, with over 150 people on the site there are 25 Kalmar / Harbour management on site to support this large team.

A real team effort by all parties has contributed to this flagship project within Onehunga, and a credit to the team's ability to work collaboratively has been a testament to the progress to date. The focus is now on the timely completion of these separable portions in the new year.

Finally, congratulations to Paul Leaver and his partner on the completion of their new home, now awaiting the arrival of their first born, a baby boy, expected in early December. The Fabric (and Kalmar) team wish you well as you experience parenthood for the first time.



SKHY 2 Apartments Stage 2

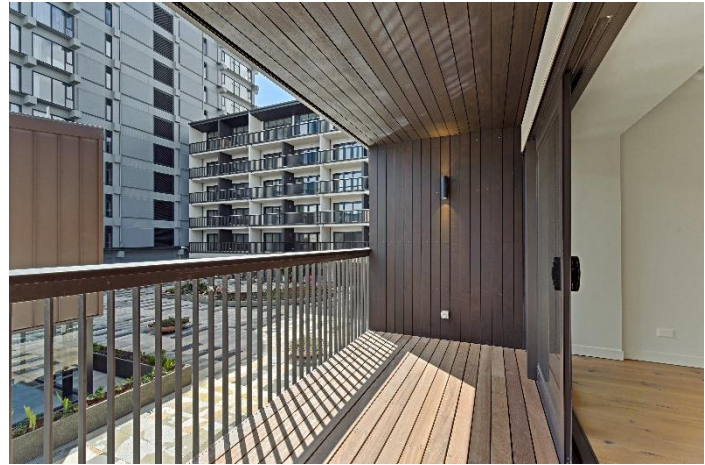
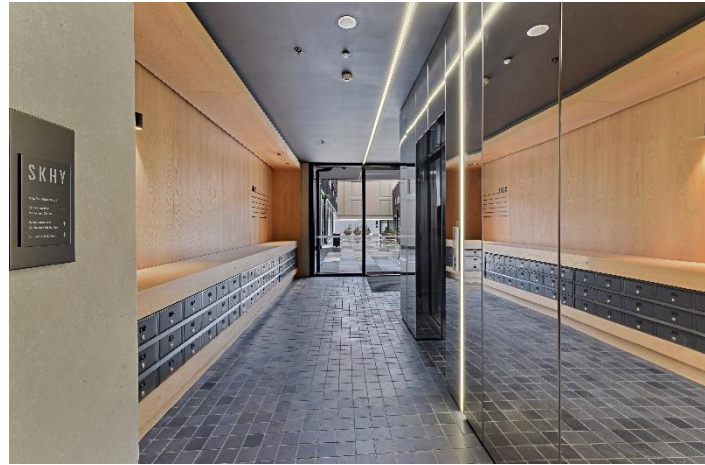
PC achieved 22nd October 2019.

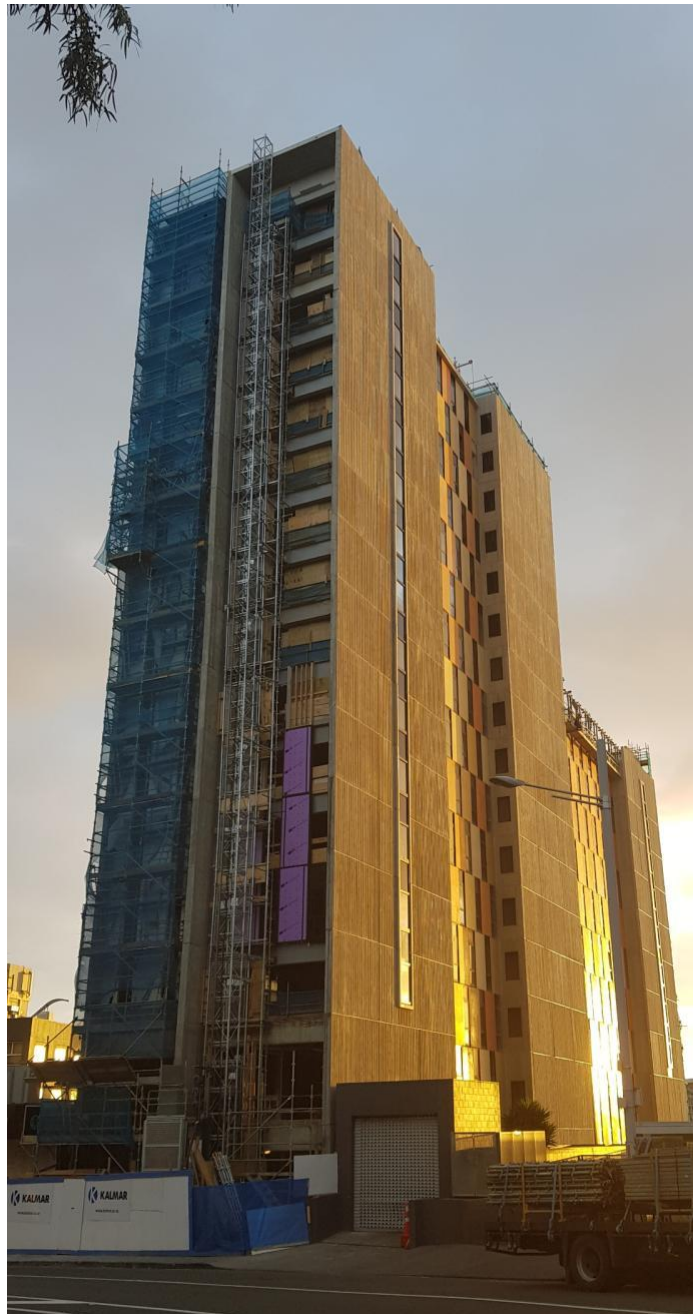

Ormiston Medical Centre

In the middle of the Ormiston Town Centre development is a new medical facility, a base build project, that Gene Larsen, Jack Armstrong and Allen Zhang have been actively working on since May 2019.

After a seasonal weather change during the earth works, the team have pushed through to complete the foundations, on grade slab, and the first tranche of structural steel. Comfloor to the first level is being laid starting the structural cycle of the mixed 2 and 3 storey building. With an extensive façade, the carpentry and cladding teams are gearing up to follow the development of the structure and maximise the summer months ahead.

The client, design and project teams are working actively through the various shop drawing phases to support the construction activities, and it's been a collective effort to manage these timeframes. In an expanding development the Medical Centre is starting to take shape and state its presence. The next few months will see significant progress leading up to the Christmas break.

Works include demolition, speedwalls, services and full fit-out of the bathroom facilities. This is a fast track project with a significant services scope in a live environment. We are on track for handing over to the client on 20th December 2020.

77 MORRISON DR – WARKWORTH

This is a medical centre fit-out for Coast to Coast Healthcare with tenants comprising Doctors, Radiology, Pharmacy, Physio and Laser Vein Treatment.

Works include full services scope, new partitions and joinery.

We have a PC date of 23rd December.

500 Queen Street

The 500 Queen Street hotel development project is progressing well, with structural steel, roof structure and external framing installed up to level 7, bringing the structural package to completion.

Fit-out works are underway with the construction of mock-up rooms progressing, steel stud internal framing and services first fix progressed to level 6. The first of 3 lifts have been installed, with the final 2 lifts to follow once the roof is complete at the end of November (roof shout confirmation to follow!).

The 500 Queen Street team dynamic has changed slightly with Wendy Tamatea leaving, but we have gained Brett Curling who brings a cool head to the project when driving the service trades and providing overall leadership.

As with all projects we have had our share of challenges, this coming in the form of consenting approvals effecting continuity on the project. Nonetheless 'Team 500' are motivated to push through these challenges for a successful project outcome.

Property Council New Zealand Hackers Golf

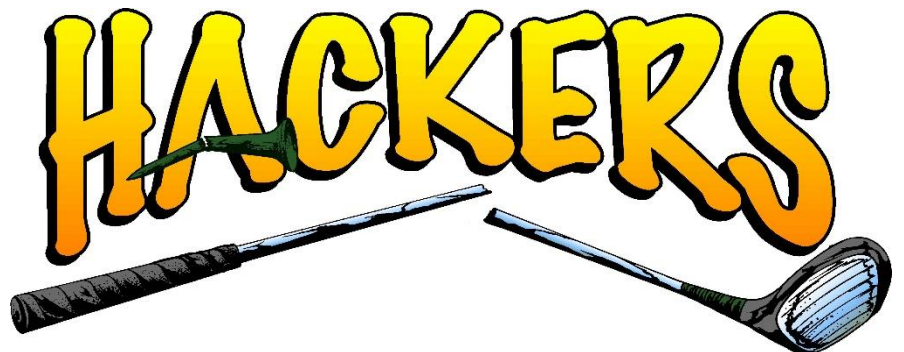
14th November 2019
