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Project Updates

Metlifecare Edgewater

Construction began on 6th September 2019 on the four three and four storey blocks for Meltlifecare. Facilities include a mix of 70 care rooms, independent living units and serviced apartments including lounge, commercial kitchen, cafe and dining room, pool and cinema. Works also include basement parking and landscaped areas. Three of the four Consents have been received. We are still waiting on Façade and Fit-out

Conqa has been set up on site for the Quality Assurance with weekly Council meetings arranged, which are audited through Conqa.

We are on programme, with piling completed on all four blocks. Underground drainage has commenced and excavation of the footings and gravel raft preparation will soon be underway.









HNZ- Atkinson Avenue

The Atkinson Avenue construction includes two blocks, made up of three "Buildings" incorporating a total of 83 units. Building 1 consists of 25 one bedroom apartments including an office, Building 2 consists of 29 two bedroom apartments including a community room / site office and Building 3 consist of 29 one bedroom apartments including plant rooms.

The site also includes 49 car parking spaces, 12 bicycle parking spaces, two buildings housing mobility scooters and waste bins and landscaped gardens with children's play area.

All units will be connected to the main services running along Atkinson Avenue.

The project is currently ahead of programme with ground floor slab and part of level 1 poured and we are well into erecting wall panels.

Matthew Luckhurst, Atkinson's summer intern has returned to study for his final year. George Watson joined Kalmar and the Atkinson team in January as a Junior Quantity Surveyor and is fitting in well. Eric Yuan who was with us on a full-time basis up until mid-January is now part-time.

We congratulate Paul and Ushanthi Leaver who have recently become first time parents. Their son Charlie was born in December. Both Ushanthi and Charlie are doing well.

The team are proud to report a score of 99.3% for their SiteSafe audit in January.



HNZ - St. George's Road

St George's Road is a \$28m apartment complex for Kāinga Ora (Housing New Zealand) in Avondale.

We're building 72 apartments ranging from one to three bedrooms across two 5 storey and one 6 storey buildings.

We established on site at the end of November 2019 and have been preparing the site with Rammed Aggregate Piles and ground beams, aiming to pour the first ground slab at the beginning of March. The project is well on track thanks to the great teamwork between Kalmar and Harbour working collaboratively to speed the structure build as much as possible, so we can be out of the ground before the Auckland rains hit.



Anzac Unilodge

The Anzac Ave construction team pulls off the near impossible!

As predicted in late September 2019, the construction team has successfully handed over the building just in time for the arrival of the students. On the morning of the 17th February 2020, 190 students queued at the reception counter eagerly awaiting sight of their new bedrooms.

From that time, Kalmar has received positive feedback from Unilodge reporting that the 'move in' went better that anticipated and they are pleased with the quality offered and the attitude of the construction team post handover.

The building received a blessing on the 11th February and this was attended by stakeholders, dignitaries from the University of Auckland and local Kaumatua. The blessing went well and everyone involved was surprised by the pace of the completion and the works achieved in a relatively short space of time.

Unfortunately, the project didn't fare well following the collapse of the original main contractor Arrow International in March 2019. However, after a solid 11 months of toil from all involved, the project team has accomplished what some said would be near impossible given the invariable date that students would be moving in.

The project team's success has been built on a culture of mindful attention, positivity and encouraging one another to exceed expectations.

Every member of the construction team should be given a well deserved pat on the back for their success.





500 Queen Street (Team 500)

The good news at 500 Queen St is that the facade consent has finally been uplifted allowing a council building inspection on 22/2/2020. This is some eight months after it was required.

Rob Telford and the team at 500 Queen St can now start to follow a normal construction sequence, through to completion.

The first fix works and the roof are well advanced and now that the windows can be installed the building can progressively become watertight and linings, second fix works and finishing works can get underway.

A sample room has been prepared and the client team are progressing their off site fitout works.

On the team front there have been a few changes over recent months. Paul Dine has moved into a Safety Role and Brett Curling has stepped into the Site Manager position. Hazel Wang has been stuck in China following travel restrictions imposed by the Corona virus and Yvonne has stepped in to assist Francois. Fabric Apartments

There's no slowing down the momentum that the site has generated having worked through the Christmas break to maintain the drive towards completion of the 161-unit residential apartment complex in Onehunga.

The added presence of supervision and subcontractors has been a contributor to seeing the project rapidly build up to support the expected handover of the first of three Separable Portions.

With building weather tightness on all the buildings achieved at the end of last year, the project has been taking full advantage of the sunshine and the dry summer months that we've been enjoying so far.

Progress has been noticeably impressive across all 3 buildings as cladding materials and finishes start coming together, forming a close resemblance to the Client and Architect sales and marketing renders. The focus on the façade has been an arduous task between all parties, and the unveiling of the long-awaited façade has started.

The first tranche of scaffold coming down will enable podium works to commence. This is a significant milestone on the project, and a credit to the collective efforts from the design and construction teams involved.

Internally on Building F the rooms are being preparing for the for the final inspections, architects, purchasers, and the council finals to the lower levels. Building A is following close behind and Building B has started internal wall and ceiling linings. Above podium site works has started, and the basement fitout is nearly complete with lining marking and locker installation underway.

The project has been under construction since May 2018, and the team led by Dario, has been focused on diligently dealing with design co-ordination to support the timely handover to meet the scheduled delivery timeframes as the project heads into the completion phase.

On the staffing front, we'd like to congratulate Ashlee Wei on the expected arrival of her 2nd daughter later this year and Willem Viljoen for finally tying the knot with his partner Michelle. We wish you both every success with the positive journey you're about to embark on.

Overall, the project is positioned well and the team remains positive for a successful completion of this development for our valued Client, Lamont and Co.



Ormiston Medical Centre

Working through the wetter season to get out of the ground, the team are now enjoying the warmer weather, and making the most of it to advance the façade works while it lasts.



The external timber framing is nearly complete on all the elevations and the installation of the rigid air barrier, window frames and the commencement of the aluminium composite panels has started to provide a slight insight into the finished product.

Internally the services trades are nearly complete across all the levels, with the base build finishes about to commence.

The team has been working closely with the client and design teams to manage the tenancy fitout challenges, and the team are focused to complete the base build on schedule to allow the tenant fitout works to commence.

Smythe Road

Following the successful completion of the last Bloom Living development (72 units) in Manurewa, this project for O&A Smythe Living is a 24-unit, 4 storey residential development in Henderson. It's keeping the team actively busy as they deal with the challenges and logistics of getting out of the ground and making hay while the sun shines in the Henderson valley.

The project is being led by Nicholas Botha with Mark Heritage keeping a watchful eye on the construction site. Both Ryno and Yulia are keeping abreast of the procurement and gearing up for set up on site with site accommodation recently established.

The project commenced in late November 2019, and since then the demolition of two existing dwellings, site establishment, bulk excavation, main drainage connections and installation of 102 rammed aggregate piers has all been achieved. A credit to the meticulous upfront planning between the Client, design and construction team.

The project has hit the ground running, and it's been a great start to a challenging site, which is bound by residential properties, with Nicholas taking a personal approach to directly managing the neighbourly relationships.

Three O Eight Remuera Gardens

"A majestic boutique residential complex of 18 ultra-generous apartments, 308 Remuera delivers rarely encountered, exceptional quality in a breath-taking northern slopes ridgeline location in the heart of Remuera Village."

Kalmar took possession of the site at 304 – 308 Remuera Road just before Christmas, ready for the start on the 6th of January this year. Since then the install of 101 piles by CLL has been completed and bulk excavation for the two basement levels is underway. Harbour have started on site with capping beams to the 6m high retaining walls. Drainage works are well underway with both public stormwater and wastewater connections completed. A Vector transformer is going to be installed in the next few weeks ready for the tower crane to be operational at the end of May.

There is limited site office space with Site Manager Brendon Vannan currently leading the onsite works along with Étienne Joubert and Francis von Moltke who are also on site. Greg Bailey is supporting the team on the H&S side, where required. The project team is being led by Lüder Stock, with assistance from Dave Colborn. Steven Francis is leading the pricing and budget setting with assistance of Rick Hattingh and Claire Ding. Once the final TMP is agreed with AT and put in place, the full team will be able to unite on site.

The 6-level building has 18 generously sized twoand three-bedroom luxury apartments and 2 levels of basement carparking. Each two bedroom and study apartment has an internal floor area of 127sqm plus a 30sqm balcony. The internal floor areas for the three bedroom and study apartments range in size between 179sqm and 318sqm.




