
The completion of the project marks the farewell of Faye and Martin, and welcome Mikhail to the team to assist with the close-out of the final accounts.

OMC is a large Design and Build Project under the guidance of Brendon Vannan. When finished it will have 102 apartments with either 1 or 2 bedrooms. There will be two levels of carparks and two retail units on the ground floor, accessed from Onehunga Mall.

The team are now well into construction of the roof slabs which will top the building out with the last slab after 8 levels

below. The team from Kalmar Concrete led by Douw van der Walt and Dillon Halsall have done a great job considering all the challenges a Design and Build Contract throws at you and the extreme weather conditions we have all had to contend with.

The façade is well underway with framing now progressing on Level 4 and windows going in on Levels 2 and 3. Jayden Liu is keeping a good eye on all those challenging construction details façade engineers test us with. Interior fit-out is also progressing on Levels 2 through to Level 4, run by Alan Watson and Henry Winsor.

All of these elements are coordinated by our Site Manager Donovan Ratner who has had to contend with all the team's challenges, getting used to a new country (he moved here from SA in November) and trying to figure out why he has come to a country that does not have a summer! Two of the team managed to go camping, goodness knows why, with one having to be moved and losing his tent to broken zips in the high wind and the other just having to sit out the weather bombs.

#### Remuera Gardens

We have been completing all the enabling works — installing a temporary bridge ("Luke's Bridge") to span a shallow 900mm public sewer, diverting a public sewer and stormwater, re-lining the inside of the public 900mm sewer line and setting up piling platforms for the piling rig and crane. This has now been done and we have the piling gear on site with piling underway.

The team are now into the next interesting phase of the project, building a large retaining wall approximately 100m long and it will be close to 5m high when excavated. The steel casings used for the piles are interlinked with steel "clutches" which are welded afterwards, creating the closure between the piles.

We have had regular meetings with the Retirement Village residents, making sure they are informed on how the project is going and what lies ahead over the coming weeks. The resident building expert in the village has been very impressed with how the team have managed the project and a few of the residents mentioned at the last meeting how well organised the site looked – great feedback. Gene Larsen has been our communication channel for the street residents, using his gentlemanly charm to keep them happy.

Since our last newsletter we have had new members join the team — Lee Savage will be running the structures teams, Harold Fulo managing the offsite manufacture and shop drawings process and Nick Rew, who will be assisting with site administration and site coordination. Welcome to the team guys, it is great to have your expertise and knowledge in the team.

# Metlifecare Oakridge Kerikeri

The Oakridge project is a new aged care facility that will be an addition to the existing Metlifecare Village in Kerikeri. The project consists of a two-storey building comprising 65 care suites and amenities for the village including a café, commercial kitchen, and hair salon. The structure of the building consists of structural steel, load bearing timber framing and cross laminated timber (CLT) flooring and walls, and the fit-out of the care suites includes the use of Bathroom pods premanufactured in Melbourne.



The team on site includes Dillon Taylor, Wayne McKeown, Edmund Changwai and Mike Azizi as well our Kalmar Concrete carpenters. They are settling in well to the new country lifestyle in the winterless north.... Since starting on site on the 10th of January the site establishment has been completed and work is well underway on the foundations and lift pits. With a mix of contractors from Auckland and locals involved in the project we have been very impressed by the cooperation and collaboration of the local contractors. The works on site will be ramping up over the following months with the first area of slab and structural steel due on site in March.

# Metlifecare Orion Point Hobsonville

Following the severe weather recently experienced the site team has welcomed the current sunshine. The site didn't escape the brunt of the storms and the team have been busy tidying up the effects of the heavy rain and strong winds. We acknowledge the "team" as a whole and Kalmar certainly appreciates the efforts of our subcontractor base.






# Foundation on George cont.

Delays were encountered due to cancelled council inspections during the storms, and we've had a few design changes with the cladding details, but despite this we remain on track to complete Stage 2 in early May and Stage 3 in July. Our client is holding an open day next week for the new residents to walk around to see our progress. It's starting to take shape with 2nd fix services now being installed.

The site team need to be congratulated for their organisation in managing a tight site within an existing village and the communication and help given to the Village Manager, at often short notice. This assists the client and helps make the project a success. Well done, keep it up.







# Proxima Residences Newton

Proxima is a 9-level apartment building, with a modern specification located on the edge of the CBD adjacent to Newton Road in Eden Terrace. There are 67 apartments between Levels 3 and 9. Apartments are a mixture of 1 & 2 bed on level 3-8 and level 9 contains 4 penthouses.





Structure from level 1-8 is made up of precast panels, half beams and rib and infill floors. The structure at level 9 and roof is structural steel lined with a combination of long run steel and membrane cladding systems.

The Façade cladding finishes are a mixture of Flashclad aluminium boarding, ACP panels and Insol louvres.

Construction has progressed to the first half of Level 6, with the floor being poured and precast panels erected. Kalmar Concrete are now in repetitive structural cycles with the structure, and façade framing, and internal partitions have now commenced on level 3 and 4 with first fix services due to start imminently.





## Proxima Residences, Newton cont.

With propping stripped from the basement level, the completion works have now commenced with the removal of the earth berm to the perimeter, shotcrete and completion of subsoil drainage.

All utilities connections are complete including the permanent power which was livened at the start or January 23.



# Te Uru Apartments Stage 8 Hobsonville

Te Uru 8 Apartments for Fletcher Living Ltd consists of three buildings; Blocks A,B & C with 72 apartments including a pocket park and EV charging station. The Project is located in Hobsonville Point opposite Memorial Park.



The project consists of two separable portions, Building's A & B, separable portion 1 and Building C, separable portion 2. Currently both separable portions are on programme for June and September 2023 delivery.

The façade, supervised by Sukhdeep Sidhu is progressing well with the warm roof completed on all three buildings, with the remaining brickwork due for completion by mid-March 2023. The scaffold has been removed on Building A and the 1st elevation on Building B is currently being dismantled. There have been challenges due to the current market conditions in available resources for bricklayers and this has now been mitigated by introducing an additional brickwork subcontractor and supplementing Building B's façade between the two teams.


