The Marlborough has recently been completed, and the purchasers are now starting to move into their apartments.



It was a rollercoaster finish. The client asked us to accelerate and deliver this project six weeks early to enable early occupation of the building.

The team set up for this enormous challenge whilst working through Covid-related issues that have impacted the construction industry. Along with our subcontractors the Kalmar teams worked tirelessly through public holidays, long weekends, and a lot of overtime to achieve the target finish.

Due to all this hard work, the project was completed six weeks ahead of the Contract Programme. The Certificate of Code Compliance was lodged and uplifted in just 4 days - this must be a record somewhere, thanks to Craig Curling, stellar effort.

We'd like to extend a huge thanks to all the subcontractors who helped Winton achieve what was once thought to be an impossible task.

This is a credit to the Kalmar finishing team (you know who you are) who helped to complete the project so effectively.

Ovation Apartments and Townhouses

Ovation Apartments

After coming off The Marlborough Apartments, resources are getting back into "the swing of things" on the Ovation Apartments. The fit-out is progressing extremely well with plasterboard up to Level 3 and paint finishes to the lower levels. Joinery will commence shortly, as we move forwards to the finishing stages of the project.

The façade works have been a challenge, but things are starting to look up, and the scaffold is expected to be dismantled shortly to unveil the finished façade with podium works commencing.

It has certainly been a challenging project with the logistical constraints of the site and managing the increasing Covid-related impacts. With the finish in sight, the team is motivated to deliver this on time, and to a high standard that is expected for these high-end boutique apartments.

Completion is expected towards the end of October 2022, so we look forward to sharing the completion pictures with you then.

The Townhouses

As a separate portion to the Ovation Apartments, the townhouses have been waiting nearly two months for the timber pre-nail frames. With these finally arriving, the carpentry crews wasted little time standing these frames and are now preparing for the roof and façade cladding materials to be installed. With a little luck, we may even be able to secure some GIB to get the linings underway.





The Barracks Hobsonville

The four-storey development, over basement car parking with an apartment on each level, is now well underway.

The site is small, at the end of a super lot and is surrounded by residential construction.

It has been a challenging start, keeping the team on their toes as they problem solve quickly to keep the momentum going.

With the lift pit and foundation complete, the basement precast panels have been installed and the in-situ columns and beams are about to progress.

We look forward to getting out of the basement and into the structural floor cycles.



Jimmy's Point Hobsonville

Jimmy's Point is the latest apartment development to commence in Launch Bay. The 30 luxury apartments are spread over 5 levels over an extensive basement level. The site is positioned against the seafront overlooking the Greenhithe waterways showcasing some exquisite views.

The Stage 1 bulk excavation work has progressed with piling works already underway with the temporary retaining walls to enable access to site. Whilst the weather has been throwing a few curve balls, the team have made good progress in the short time they have been on site.

With the Stage 2 pricing now complete, the balance of the project has been awarded, so procurement teams will be actively working to secure trades in a challenging market.

This period should see the completion of the bulk excavation and piling works, with the tower crane planned to be installed in late September 2022.


Onehunga Mall Club

Foundation on George Parnell

The Foundation project has really kicked into gear with the structure starting to assert itself on the Parnell skyline. The onsite structure team, led by Michael van der Walt and Iloa Pauu has been able to maintain a consistent floor cycle despite the challenges we have faced with precast and reinforcing supply, not to mention the grueling winter weather. The Level 3 slab is due to be completed at the end of June and Level 4 is targeted to be completed by the end of July.

Jason Underhay has recently joined the team as Façade Manager, just as the scaffold is starting to shroud the structure. The building wrap is advancing up the facade elevations and the ground floor windows are due to be installed in the first week of July. Following window installation, we plan to commence the ornate limestone façade.

Shifting to the interiors, we have commenced with the internal fit-out of the ground floor, forming part of Separable Portion 1, which will be occupied by Blind and Low Vision New Zealand. The internal framing has started on the ground floor alongside several service trades. The Level 1 sample unit is due to commence with the internal framing in the first week of July, all this under the watchful eye of a familiar face to some, David Karim, who recently returned to Kalmar.

The demolition of Awhina House, a 3-storey concrete building has certainly posed a challenge during the planning stages. A complex demolition methodology is required due to the proximity to a birthing centre, and to meet the low levels of noise/vibrations allowable under the resource consent. The demolition is due to start at the end of October 2022.

The commercial team, led by Olivia Li, continues to battle the everchanging market conditions. As we know the construction sector in New Zealand is experiencing major issues with supply, however the team has worked extremely hard to achieve our procurement milestones for the project.

The Foundation team has really grown exponentially as we welcome several new staff members to the team, Jacobus (Kowie) Mienie (Project Manager), Zander Paulsen (QS), David Karim (Fit-out), Henry Winsor (Fit-out), Tony Swortzel (Fit-out), Jason Underhay (Façade) and Samantha Turner (Site Administration).

The team is focused on delivering a first-class product to our client, Generus Living.

The Grove Stages 2 and 3 Orewa

In March we were awarded Stage 3, an additional 24 units to the Stage 2 building currently under construction



Stage 2 has been progressing well with the structure completed on time and the roof now commencing. Windows have started to be installed and we head toward getting the building watertight so fit-out works can progress further.

The Stage 3 structure was delayed due to a live Vector power cable running through the site. This has now been relocated and we have commenced with the foundations.

Off-site works have been continuing with precast shop drawings and manufacture starting, ready for installation in July.

The site team has grown with Anthony Bugarin, Jason Petersen, NJ van Zyl and Murray Johnson (Grumpy Gnome recipient, four years running). We welcome the newcomers to the team who bring experience and skills to the project that will contribute to its success.

The site team and subcontractors have seen their fair share of illness due to Covid-19, flu and colds, but despite this we are tracking very well on the project. A big thank you to all staff members who step up to fill the gaps when required. It's very much appreciated.

With the winter weather on top of us, we have a couple of months to battle through. However, we are looking forward to spring and putting winter behind us.

Proxima Residences Newton

Proxima is a 9 Level building made up of 2½ levels of parking and 7½ levels of apartments adjacent to Newton Road in Eden Terrace. The apartments are a mixture of 63 single units and 4 penthouses.



Since commencing the project, in November last year, things have progressed well through the dry summer and autumn months. To date the piling, capping beam and bulk excavation have been completed along with the first stage of shotcrete to the retaining piles.

Sewer connections in Randolph Street have also been installed along with all internal stormwater and wastewater drainage.

The tower crane has been erected and the CMTP traffic management plan has finally been approved by Auckland Transport after a 6-month consultation process.

Detailed dig works are well underway, but the wet start to the winter season is proving challenging when forming ground beams and pile caps and completing membrane systems. The lift base was poured on 13th June and the first precast panels were installed to the lift shaft on the 15th.

Tanking and steel fixing is progressing in the ground beams and pile caps, and the first pour is planned for early July.





The Structural Engineers' construction methodology requires an earth bund to remain in place at the base of the retaining piles, to control deflection in the retaining wall, until the level 2 slab has been cast. This is planned to be completed by the beginning of September.

The site team have been working in collaboration with the design consultants and supply chain to finalise the façade design and ensuring building consent application for the façade and fit-out was submitted on time.

Thomas Van Roekel, supported by Pierre Gonzales and Viki Guo are looking after the commercials and building a relationship with the PQS and have made good progress with groundwork variations.

The site delivery team lead by Neil Spencer has developed further with Dave Tauariki joining the team after recently returning from Australia to lead Harbour. Thanks to James Stevens for getting this project off to a solid start and a big welcome to Hirini Maguire.

Te Uru Apartments Stage 8 Hobsonville

Te Uru 8 Apartments for Fletcher Living Ltd consists of three buildings; Blocks A,B & C with 72 apartments including a pocket park and EV charging station. The Project is located in Hobsonville Point opposite Memorial Park.

For buildings A&B the piling and foundations have been completed with the cycle of in-situ floors, structural steel and precast concrete panels well underway. On Building C the ground floor pour is being targeted for completion in July.

The façade construction has commenced on Building A with a mock-up of a section of this being presented to the façade engineer for review and approval.

The ongoing effect of Covid is causing disruption to the supply and manufacturing chain. A member of our team is visiting factories to mitigate the impact on programme and sequence of work.

We welcome new Kalmar additions to the team Garth Robertson looking after the façade, Jannie van den Berg responsible for the fit-out and Katerina Boyarkina assisting with quantity surveying.

Jessica Brewitt and James Stevens have also relocated from other Kalmar projects and joined the team as Quantity Surveyor and Site Manager respectively. Jess has recently returned from a successful 3-month campervan trip around New Zealand. After the highlight of swimming with the dolphins and finally selling her van, we are pleased to welcome her back to the team.






