And just like that, it's December!

The past 10 months were incredibly productive for the Foundation team, with exceptional progress made on-site. Only six months ago, the team was completing the foundations, and now we are closing the year with Level 2 slab poured and the basement propping removed!

The journey to date has certainly not been without its challenges. One notable hurdle was achieving the workability required for the 50MPa concrete slabs - extensive pre-pour testing was necessary to determine the correct mix. Three options (A, B, and C) were evaluated before the Ground Floor Area A slab pour, with option A selected as the most workable - however, after setting, surface cracking appeared. While non-structural, this issue persisted in Area B, prompting the team to switch to option B. Since then, option B has proven successful throughout.

A special recognition must go to the Kalmar Concrete crew for their relentless efforts across the year, with work being extremely labour-intensive, involving in-situ walls, columns, and slabs. The team have hit their stride and consistently outpace the planned pour dates. Cole continues to support the team and ensure they have the correct material, labour and equipment when required he is now based on site until the end of the structure. Another big thanks goes to Iloa, who has been a fantastic motivator. Of course, he has been well-supported by structural supervisors; Wehan, Arona, Laksh, Tony, Joe, and Vincent. With seven major slab pours remaining, the team is focused on finishing strong and eagerly anticipating the roof shout in the new year!

Progress on the facade is advancing steadily, with European Stone Masons installing Proclima, Hilti brackets, and Rockwool insulation in preparation for the stonework installation in 2025. Domingo is leading the charge on this, supported by Neil, who is overseeing Asphaltecs waterproofing and the scaffolding operations. The facade trades are eager to make progress and next year and the team will be reinforced by Dylan Fourie and Harrison in the new year.

Meanwhile, fit out works for the sample unit have begun, offering an opportunity to refine critical details and dimensions which Nikolai is persistently driving and staying ahead of. These issues are being addressed with the architects to ensure a smoother process going forward. Adam Domok also recently joined as a first-fix supervisor and we wish him a speedy recovery following his knee operation. The fit-out team will be led by Donavan Ratner who is has recently joined us.

A heartfelt thank you goes to Michael van der Walt for his nine years of dedicated service to Kalmar, including his invaluable contributions at Foundation. Mike has been an integral part of the team, and while it is bittersweet to see him leave, we wish him great success in his new opportunity in Australia—we know he will excel! 



## Karakia at Kalmar

In Parnell, Kalmar and Wolfgramm Holdings hosted a *karakia* (blessing) ceremony at their construction site, led by a member of Ngāti Whātua, to bring peace and healing following a recent tragedy on the premises.

Invitations were extended to neighbours and community members, with 21 people attending to honour the space. The ceremony lasted just over half an hour, followed by a water cleansing ritual and *whakanoa*—a gathering with tea and biscuits.

To respect the sacred event, all machinery was halted, and Filipino and Māori staff joined the blessing, expressing gratitude for the spiritual comfort it provided. Attendees were advised that children and pregnant women should not attend, recognizing the area as a spiritual space during the *karakia*.


