PROJECT UPDATE YORK HOUSE, PARNELL NEIL BALL

Construction on the York House Development is now in full swing, featuring 44 high-end residences. Developed by Precinct & Icon Developments, the project lies in the heart of Parnell.

Since Christmas, the team has been focussed on completing key milestones, including the installation of the concrete-reinforced piles, perimeter capping beams and ground anchors, all in preparation for the bulk earthworks phase.

With bulk excavation now underway, the team has made good progress, despite a few in-ground challenges. This positive advancement has been supported by favourable weather conditions and careful planning and coordination by the site team to maintain a good relationship with the surrounding residential neighbourhood.

The saying goes, 'What goes up, must come down', but in this case, what goes down, must come up! The team is nearing completion of the vertical descent phase with the bulk excavation, and once finished, the focus will shift to foundation work, followed by the construction of a two-level basement to support the six-level tower above.

The next major step will be the installation of the luffing tower crane, essential for the project's structural phase. Given the tight site constraints, this will be installed inside one of the lift shafts.

Leading the team is Dillon, with Gerhard managing site operations. The Kalmar Concrete crew is overseen by Lee, supported by Joseph & Eric, while Paul & Harold keep ahead of design and coordination. The QS team, comprising Olivia, Yulia & Grace provides essential support with our Construction Cadet Michael, while Ann heads up the Health & Safety team.

As the colder months approach, the team is racing to complete the in-ground activities before Winter sets in. Until next time, it's over and out from the York House Team.

PROJECT UPDATE FABRIC² NEIL BALL

This project, formally known as FABRIC on Spring Street, has undergone a marketing and brand refresh and is now officially named Fabric².

Much like the squared notion in mathematics, the momentum on site continues to multiply, as we develop the 118 apartments in Onehunga for Precinct Properties. The number of workers on site continues to rise, with construction now underway across all areas of the project.

Under Lance's leadership, with support from Shane, Eric & Omer, the structure for both buildings is nearing completion. The final slab pour is scheduled for early April, marking a significant milestone for the project and a huge achievement for Kalmar Concrete, as well as the subcontractors and suppliers involved.

Our focus has now shifted to the façade elements, with Jason and Arthur working to make the building watertight. This will enable Alan and Derrik to move forward with the fitout works now that all building consents have been uplifted. Looking ahead, we plan to have the roof structure and cladding installed in the coming months, so don't forget to mark your calendars for the roof shout celebration in July.

The success of this project is down to the entire team: Brendon on his leadership, our QS team of Donald, Liam, Thomas & Jervis. Jerrin, our coordination guru, Paul Dine, our H&S Champion, Sam our Administration Superstar and James Stevens, who tirelessly ensures the site stays on track.

While the team has been hard at work, they've also made time for some fun and team bonding including fishing with ZYJ and paintball against the Foundation team (where Fabric won in spectacular fashion!) Thanks Sam, for all your planning and organising.

We look forward to seeing you at the roof shout in July. Until then, signing out from the Fabric² team!

PROJECT UPDATE FOUNDATION BUILDING 2 NICHOLAS BOTHA

It's been a GREAT Summer! The Foundation team is on the move, carrying forward the momentum from last year. Since December, slabs for Levels 1-4, Area A, have all been successfully poured – with the Level 4 slab alone being a massive 420m³ of concrete! The structure team should be extremely proud of their progress so far, with the structure just needing 2 slab pours and 2 roof pours for completion. Keep up the great work; You are absolutely smashing it!

As the structure nears completion, both façade and fitout works are well underway. The façade team has installed windows on the ground floor and has now began Level 1. The stone crew has started installing stone on the façade, marking an incredible milestone. So far, around 650 pieces of stone have been installed, and soon, European Stone Masons will be placing over 100 pieces per day, with each stone weighing up to 50kg. Only 15,850 stones to go. No pressure, team!

Fitout is also gaining momentum, with the sample unit scheduled for completion in June. Walls have been lined and ceiling framing has begun. Completing this unit will set the benchmark for the remaining units, and we are excited to see it finished. On the Ground Floor, steel stud framing has been installed, along with nogs for services, and first fix has also commenced. Eurotech have also begun work on the Level 1&2 external balcony walls.

It's not all work at Foundation! The team has enjoyed milestone BBQs to celebrate slab completions, Friday drinks at the Lumsden and the Fabric v Foundation paintball event. Needless to say, Foundation came out on top! ⁽ⁱ⁾ It was a fantastic opportunity to reconnect with colleagues from other sites and enjoy some friendly competition.

The team will be getting a personnel boost with LordKarlo Ibarra & Aaron Goddard rejoining Kalmar, and Matt Morris joining the Kalmar family too. We look forward to seeing you all give your best on Kalmar's flagship project. We have also recently had Summer Foley, our Kalmar-sponsored Keystone Trust student working with us and bid farewell to Zander, who is off to Australia. We wish you all the best, mate. It has been a pleasure working with you!





PROJECT UPDATE PARK GREEN CRAIG MULLANE

The Park Green Neighbourhood Centre has now been finalised, with Practical Completion being achieved on 14 January 2025.

We are now just putting the finishing touches to some post PC client variations in line with Best Start's Ministry of Education Inspections.

PROJECT UPDATE ELYSIAN BRANDEN VENTER

Construction on the Elysian Apartments commenced on January 29, 2025. This exciting project, located in the prime suburb of Parnell, will feature 16 luxury apartments with 2, 3 and 4-bedroom layouts with great north-facing harbour views.

A Glimpse into the Project

The apartments will be spread across levels 1-5, with the basement and ground floor dedicated to parking and amenities, including a private spa, sauna and wellness treatment room. The façade will feature a unique blend of cladding systems and bronze anodized aluminium joinery the hero being the natural stone imported from Oman, coming in a range of profiles including flat, fluted and scalloped, with tiles weighing an impressive 54kg!

Construction Underway

Our team is excited to have broken ground, and the LRD 23 double rotary piling rig is now established, with piling works underway. With a total of 283 piles to install, ranging in depth from 8-13m, we hope that the good weather sticks around and the gumboots don't need to make an appearance!

Meet the Team

Our site team consists of Murray Johnson (Site Manager) and Joy Rivera (Project Coordinator), with Lance Bloomfield and Eric Yuan joining soon to take care of the structure. Our project QS team includes Luca Denee, Thomas Van Roekel and newcomer Cameron Hames, who we wish all the best on his new role at Kalmar. We also extend congratulations to Luca on his recent wedding to Emma, which took place on beautiful Waiheke.

What's Next?

We're looking forward to watching the project take shape over the coming 22 months, with completion expected in November 2026. We'll keep you updated on the progress and milestones achieved along the way.





PROJECT UPDATE CHELSEA RISE LUKE KUS

We are pleased to announce that construction has begun on the Chelsea Rise Apartment project. The project consists of 73 premium apartments split over 6 levels, with 4 Penthouse suites on level 7 enjoying great views over the Chelsea Sugar Factory and the Harbour Bridge to the CBD.

After some negotiations to finalise the contract, work on site commenced on 24 March, with the aim of completion being achieved in early 2027.

It's early days still, but the team on site (just Zubin for now), are keen to get into it with demolition, public drainage and piling all gearing up in quick succession.

With some onerous resource consent conditions, keen-eyed neighbours and the famous Onewa Road to contend with, we will need to be well organised to ensure this project runs smoothly. With the aid of our subcontractors, who are being signed up as we speak, I am sure it will be a success.



PROJECT UPDATE NORTH SHORE RIDING FOR THE DISABLED TIM ELLERY

North Shore Riding For The Disabled is a charity-funded association offering horse riding experiences to disabled children. The staff tell us the kids "light up" when they arrive and it's all big smiles and fun while they are there. You can appreciate the importance of such a facility.

This project was a community project (heavily subsidised by Kalmar) to build two new horse stable blocks, with Murray Johnson heading the build.

In late December we started at the site in Stillwater and got the main timber poles concreted in before the Christmas break. On his return in January, the other materials arrived, and Murray was back into it. Little did he know how good the weather was going to be and being in a non-sheltered section of the farm, it probably seemed like 40^oC!

Within 3 weeks the build was complete, including the roof and an apron slab out the front and they started operating again early February.

PROJECT UPDATE INTERIORS JUSTIN DE BEER

As our Kalmar Interiors team returned from a well-deserved summer break, it was straight back into work mode with practical completion being achieved across several projects.

Skills Group – Skills (\$3million)

This project was an alteration and refurbishment to the internal and external spaces of an existing industrial building, which was altered to provide a fit for purpose new teaching facility for trade-based learning, including electrical and associated staff facilities. Due to the exceptionally short project timeline, the Client adopted an Early Contractor Involvement procurement approach.

Kensington House (\$5.5million)

Kensington House is an existing single level care building containing care rooms, care suites and associated amenities and back of house provisions. The project involved a full re-roofing, recladding and conversion of the existing 32 small care rooms into 11 larger care rooms and 6 multi-room suites. The building remained occupied and operational throughout the 12-month project. Trades included roofing, demolition, carpentry, concrete, all services and finishes.

University of Auckland – Early Childcare Education Centre (\$1million)

This project was a refurbishment of the existing tenancy to accommodate the Early Childcare Education Centre. Project scope included an internal refresh, featuring acoustic walls and cut out panels, glazing, replacing kitchens, bespoke joinery and all services.





ELYSIAN GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY PHIL WILLIAMS

The groundbreaking ceremony for Elysian took place on Wednesday 19 March, marking a significant milestone for the project. The event was held onsite, with the Honourable Mayor Wayne Brown in attendance, alongside HR Group, Kalmar, Crossan Architects and Colliers International.

The ceremony began with a Karakia and site blessing led by Wolfgramm Holdings, followed by speeches from Hannah Williamson (HR Group), Mayor Wayne Brown and Bert Denee. This event marks the beginning of an exciting journey for Elysian, setting the stage for the next phase of development.
