CHELSEA RISE

What a strong start to the year it has been at Chelsea Rise!

Following a well-deserved Christmas and New Year break, the team returned to site with great momentum and picked up right where we left off.

Over the past three months, significant progress has been made on the structure. Both the Level 0 and Level 1 basements have now been poured, with a special mention to Lance for his timely cameo and contribution to this milestone.

In the superstructure, we are approaching another key achievement, with the penthouse slab scheduled to be poured shortly after the Easter break. This will allow us to commence works on the roof steel structure and plant deck, with the team eagerly anticipating having the roof installed by the end of June.

Façade works continue to progress strongly, with Lordkarlo leading the charge. The teams have been driving vertical progress up the building, completing nib waterproofing, installing framing, windows and glazing, as well as balcony sliders. The quality and pace of progress to date are tracking very well.

Internally, works are in full swing. The fit-out team has been pushing ahead since January, progressing steel framing, first-fix services, and now lining to Level 1. With Edmund, Jack, and Harrison now on board, we have a well-resourced team managing the floors and maintaining a smooth workflow for all contractors.

A strong focus remains on delivering the sample apartment ahead of the broader programme, ensuring any refinements are addressed early and a clear standard is set for the remainder of the project.

We are busy, motivated, and looking forward to achieving several key milestones over the coming quarter. Stay tuned for the next update.

Construction update:

Since our last update, Elysian Apartments in Parnell has continued to make strong progress, with the project now transitioning from structure into the façade and fitout phases. A key milestone has been achieved with the pour of the first half of the Ground floor, final slab, marking the structure nearing completion. This has been delivered using a top-down construction methodology, allowing the team to efficiently progress both the superstructure and the lower-level works in parallel.

With the roof structure complete, the warm roof system is underway, with the vapor barrier installed and the building achieving weathertightness. This has enabled fitout and façade works to ramp up, with aluminium joinery installation progressing across multiple levels, alongside the commencement of cladding systems. The imported natural stone and supporting rail system are now being installed, marking a key step in the façade works. Internally, framing, linings, and first-fix services continue to advance, particularly across the lower levels.

Meet the team

The project site team consists of Jason Underhay (Site Manager), Laksh Jaishankar (Project Coordinator), Jannie van den Berg, Darrin Green, Derrick Morby (Fitout), Marc Barton (Façade), Shane Punter (Structures), Eric Yuan (Reinforcing) and Paul Dine (HSE Manager). Supporting the project delivery is our commercial team—Thomas van Roekel, Luca Denee, Cameron Hames and Liam Dorotich, who continue to provide valuable commercial and programme support.

What's next

Focus will now be on accelerating façade installation and progressing internal fitout. With multiple work fronts now open, the project is well positioned to maintain momentum toward completion at the end of November 2026.

PROJECT UPDATE

FOUNDATION BUILDING 2

Following a well-deserved break over the Christmas period, the team has returned to site energised and ready to push forward into the final stages of the project. The momentum has been excellent, with strong progress being made across all areas and a continued focus on maintaining the high standards achieved to date.

Significant milestones have been achieved internally across multiple levels. Ground Floor and Level 1 architectural inspections have now been completed. Levels 2 and 3 architectural inspections are progressing very well, continuing to return results that reflect the high-quality workmanship delivered by the team. Level 4 apartment architects' inspections are due to commence in April, with Level 5 being completed during the month of May.

On Level 4, final coats of paint have now been completed, with Kalmar snagging currently underway and carpet installation commencing this week. Level 5 has also reached an important stage, with final coats of paint now underway.

Externally, the project has reached a major visual milestone. All scaffold has now been dismantled across every elevation, fully revealing the building envelope and opening multiple areas for landscaping works to begin. A total of 15600 pieces of stone have been installed on the façade, with the remaining 677 pieces to be complete on the Ground Floor patios and final course above the Ground Floor.

Contrax has commenced hard landscaping across key areas, working in behind Asphaltech's waterproofing, who continue to stay ahead to ensure smooth progress across the site. The transformation is significant, and the building is now looking extremely impressive as these finishing elements come together.

The team continues to show great motivation and commitment as we move through these final stages.

The quality of work across all trades is excellent, and the overall energy on site remain strong, positioning the project well for a successful, early completion.



PROJECT UPDATE

YORK HOUSE, PARNELL

In the first quarter of the year, the structure has topped out which is a great milestone for the whole project team. The structure began with piling in October 2024, and after a complex construction methodology for the 2-storey basement and challenging insitu and post tensioned concrete superstructure, it's a great accomplishment for the entire team to achieve this milestone. The static placing boom will be removed by the end of March, after pumping close to 2000 cubic meters of concrete since it was installed in September last year, and the tower crane will be removed later in May once the roof framing has been completed. Both the concrete placing boom, and the tower crane have been installed through the 2 lift shafts of the building so removing these will allow the lift installation to begin.

As the structure has climbed, the façade works as been taking shape below with the balcony prep work and external framing now up to Level 3, and window installation commencing on Level 2. With the elements that have been completed on the Ground floor and Level 1, we are starting to get a glimpse of how impressive the façade will look once completed. The building has now been encased in the perimeter scaffolding which will make for a great reveal of the façade once removed later in the year.

The increase in the number of trades on site is keeping Gerhard busy so he has been glad to see Mark Way and James Stevens recently join the team, joining Alan Watson to run the fit out works inside who are making great progress with the basement services installation now largely completed, and the apartment fit out well underway on Level 0, 1 and 2. The sample apartment has proved to be a worthwhile exercise enabling this to be used to work out any quirks in the design before they affect the other apartments and it is a welcome sign to see GIB on the walls and ceilings installed after the challenges of the first fix services. The post tensioned structural design is also starting to show its benefits with the unobstructed space in what is otherwise a very tight ceiling void.

The project team is continuing to ramp up as finishing trades get ready to begin and build on the momentum already on site, to get to the completion of the project in November. It's going to be a challenging year, but the team is more than capable of delivering this great project, and we're all looking forward to how impressive this building will be once completed and the enjoyment the future residents will have in these apartments.

Terracat Office Fitout (\$1.5m)

With Practical Completion achieved at the end of February, we extend our thanks to St John's College Trust Board, PwC Advisory Services, Colliers, and the wider project team for being part of the journey. We're pleased to welcome Terra Cat and Transpec back into their refreshed office space and thank them for their patience and understanding while works were carried out alongside day-to-day operations.

The 2,000m² fit-out included upgrades to amenities, office areas, kitchens, seismic restraints, mechanical systems, and electrical services to support the new layout. A big thank you to the Kalmar Interiors team — especially Ben and Shifty — for the long hours and commitment required to deliver the project. The result is a space to be proud of.



University of Auckland B903 RIO Fitout – Newmarket Campus(\$5m)

Work is progressing well as we approach the first major milestone, with a strong focus on completing all high-level works before the removal of the birdcage scaffolding spanning the 1,000m² site.

Our scope includes major upgrades to existing mechanical and electrical services, seismic strengthening, feature Autex ceilings, and a full interior refurbishment.

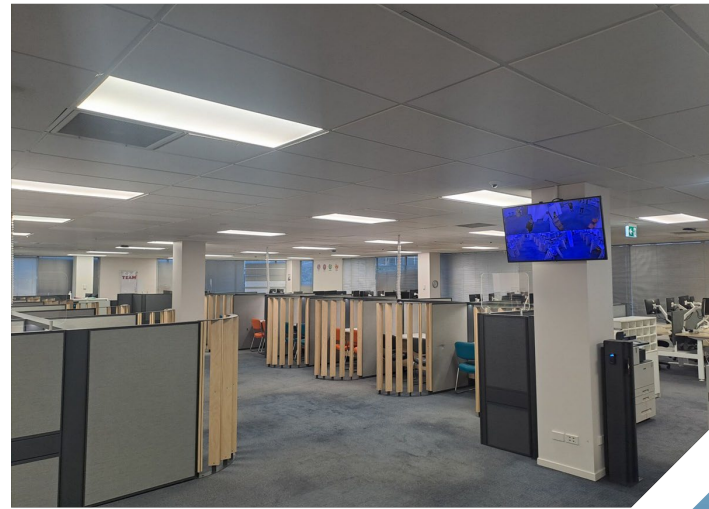

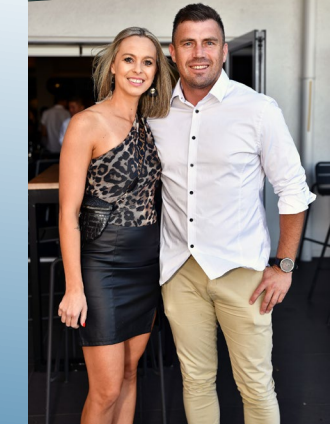
